Welcome

The meeting was called to order at 8:04 AM. New Committee Members Meagan Sexton and Michael Catudal were introduced. The next Advisory Committee will be canceled because it is Bike to Work Day on the same morning, May 21. The July 16 meeting will be virtual with an update from the County's Purple Line manager.

Minutes

The Committee approved the Minutes from the January 15 Advisory Committee Meeting.

Presentations/Updates

Listening Session – Urban Loading and Delivery Iftin Thompson, Matt Folden, Montgomery County Planning.

- The Planning Department selected downtown Bethesda for a study on Urban Loading and Delivery.
- An assessment of current road and curb conditions in downtown Bethesda was conducted by Planning.
- Current conditions delivery trucks not always using loading docks instead parking in vehicle roadway blocking traffic, delivery trucks sometimes block sidewalks and bike lanes, sometimes the loading docks are blocked by dumpsters, old buildings do not have loading areas.
- Planning has met with stakeholders to gather feedback, similar to what they are doing at this meeting.
- Planning will look at other urban areas to determine best practices.
- Question Can deliveries be restricted to overnight? Answer –
 Feedback from delivery and businesses is that receiving company needs
 to be present to accept deliveries in many cases, so deliveries need to
 be when businesses have staff working.

• Final report will most likely go to the Planning Board in early July.

Kristen Blackmon informed the Committee that **Bike to Work Day, on May 21** will be hosted at local bicycle shops this year, due to COVID restrictions, with no major event. (BTS usually hosts an event at Woodmont and Bethesda Avenues with table partners and Advisory Committee Members helping as volunteers for the morning event, in place of the usual Committee Meeting.) BTS is working with Commuter Connections and MCDOT to coordinate cyclist shirt pick up at Griffin Cycle and Terrapin Bicycles in Bethesda.
